


Image: U.S. Navy SEALs approaching Osama bin Laden's compound in Abbottabad, Pakistan

Image: A memorial at the site of the 9/11 attacks in New York City

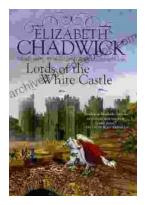

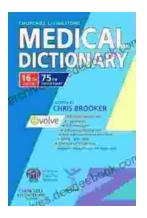
