## **4. Simple Ring**

Complete a series of half-hitches and then loop the thread around the end of the shuttle facing you. Tighten the loop to form a ring. This ring serves as

the foundation for various tatting patterns.

## **5. Double Rings**

Create a simple ring, followed by another simple ring that shares the same center point. These interconnected rings form a double ring, expanding the design possibilities.

## **6. Joining Rings**

To connect multiple rings, pass the thread through the center of a ring and form a picot. Repeat this process to join as many rings as desired.

## **7. Chain Stitch**

Form a picot and insert the shuttle into the center of a ring. Create a half-hitch and draw the thread through the ring, tightening it to form a chain stitch.

## **8. Closing the Lace**

Once the desired design is complete, join the last ring to the beginning of the lace using a half-hitch or chain stitch. Trim any excess thread, and secure the ends with a small knot.

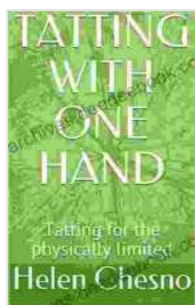

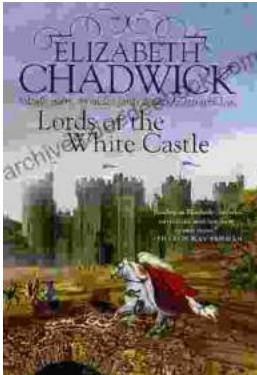
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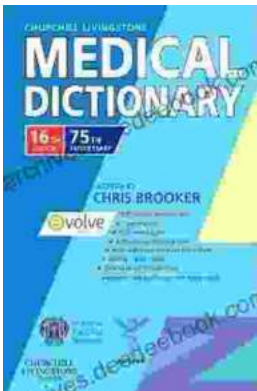
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
